Psalm: Page 34 in the Worship Supplement.



**SCRIPTURE READINGS
FOR TODAY**

Proverbs 25:6-7 NKJV

Do not exalt yourself in the presence of the king, and do not stand in the place of the great; for it is better that he say to you, "Come up here," than that you should be put lower in the presence of the prince, whom your eyes have seen.

Hebrews 13:1-8 NKJV

Let brotherly love continue. Do not forget to entertain strangers, for by so doing some have unwittingly entertained angels. Remember the prisoners as if chained with them—those who are mistreated—since you yourselves are in the body also.

Marriage is honorable among all, and the bed undefiled; but fornicators and adulterers God will judge. Let your conduct be without covetousness; be content with such things as you have. For He Himself has said, "I will never leave you nor forsake you." So we may boldly say: "The Lord is my helper; I will not fear. What can man do to me?"

Remember those who rule over you, who have spoken the word of God to you, whose faith follow, considering the outcome of their conduct. Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever.

Luke 14:1, 7-14 NKJV

Now it happened, as He went into the house of one of the rulers of the Pharisees to eat bread on the Sabbath, that they watched Him closely....

So He told a parable to those who were invited, when He noted how they chose the best places, saying to them: "When you are invited by anyone to a wedding feast, do not sit down in the best place, lest one more honorable than you be invited by him; and he who invited you and him come and say to you, 'Give place to this man,' and then you begin with shame to take the lowest place. But when you are invited, go and sit down in the lowest place, so that when he who invited you comes he may say to you, 'Friend, go up higher.' Then you will have glory in the presence of those who sit at the table with you. For whoever exalts himself will be humbled, and he who humbles himself will be exalted."

Then He also said to him who invited Him, "When you give a dinner or a supper, do not ask your friends, your brothers, your relatives, nor rich neighbors, lest they also invite you back, and you be repaid. But when you give a feast, invite the poor, the maimed, the lame, the blind. And you will be blessed, because they cannot repay you; for you shall be repaid at the resurrection of the just."

Comments on the first month of the new fiscal year:

- The General Fund offerings were \$60,917 which was \$14,083 short of budget
- General Fund expenditures were over budget because of larger than normal Missions expenditures
- July ILC operations receipts are normally low pending the start of the fall semester
- MDF expenditures included \$4,216 for foreign Exploratory/Outreach
- IIF expenditures included \$6,838 for professorage repairs
- A \$40,000 special gift was received for the ILC Building account
- The Reserve Account incorrectly reported a disbursement of \$7,395 at the end of June to cover an FY16 deficit. The \$26,415 receipt is a corrected result of the Fy16 year-end totals.
